# High School Graduation Requirements

24 credits 2.0 Unweighted GPA 210nline course 1 Fine Art course Take/Pass required assessments Community Service Project: 25 Hours

#### **Assessments:**

Pass 10th grade FSA ELA

Pass one math EOC (Algebra or Geometry)
OR

Meet concordant score on SAT/ACT

### What courses do you need to graduate?

#### Core classes:

English all 4 years= 4 credits

Math all 4 years = 4 credits

Science 3 years = 3credits

Social Studies 3 years= 3 credits

#### **Required Electives:**

HOPE (1 year= 1 credit) or 1/2 PE 1/2

Personal Fitness

Fine or Performing Art (1 year = 1 credit)

1 online course

\*Foreign Language: A minimum of 2 years of the same language is required for Bright Futures

Scholarship and FL SUS college admissions

\*Other electives: You will take at least 8 electives throughout your 4 years of high school



### COMMUNITY SERVICE



- Graduation requirement for all students
- Minimum of 25 total hours before graduation
- Non-profit organization
- Virtual Volunteer Opportunities available
- Students must complete Community Service Project forms to receive credit for hours.
- Hours should be turned in by December of senior year.

### What should you be doing now?

- Narrowing down the list of schools you want to apply to.
- Pick a major, if you are sure what you want to study.
- Start Applying NOW!
- Write and Rewrite your Essays- ask an English teacher to help you revise and edit.
- Ask for recommendations from previous teachers/counselor who know you well.
- Register for the SAT and/or ACT

# Applying to College

#### Process:

- Complete and Submit the Application
  - Directly through the university's website, Common App, SendEDU, Coalition
- Pay the Application Fee directly to the university
- Send supplemental materials
  - Transcripts, Test Scores, Letters of Recommendation, etc.
- Verify that the college(s) have received the supplemental materials

## College Applications

#### Deadlines:

- Early Action Non-Binding
  - Some Schools Have Restrictive Early Action
- Early Decision Binding
  - Can only apply to 1 school as ED
- Regular Admissions 

   Ex: FSU, UF, UM
- Rolling Admissions Ex: FAU, FIU, UCF, USF

## College Applications

 Common Application: One platform to submit an application for multiple schools

SendEDU: Electronic document transfer website

 SSAR: Self-reported transcript. Used by many schools. Filled out by the student.

    - Use if you are starting in the Summer of 2022
    - Need your parent's 2019 tax return
  - 2022-2023 Application Available October 1st
    - Need your parent's 2020 tax return
